The UN works to maintain international peace and security by facilitating communication between nations. It contributes towards peaceful resolutions of complex political, social, economic and ecological problems and serves as a centre for harmonising actions in attaining common goals.

The United Nations is the main international organisation working for peace and justice. It was created in 1945 and now has 192 member nations.

The importance of attracting the support of the whole world community was recognised from the beginning and no other international organisation has done as much to help public participation in world affairs.

Some United Nations Achievements

1. Keeping the peace when conflicts threaten international security - by providing a forum for negotiation, or sending blue berets multinational peacekeeping forces to stabilise a crisis.
2. Protecting the environment by bringing governments together to prevent climate change, air and water pollution, extinction of species, depletion of natural resources and many other problems.
3. Helping in emergencies by organising humanitarian relief and food supplies for millions of refugees and victims of famine and natural and man-made disasters around the world.
4. Fighting poverty by helping the poor to help themselves through development projects. The gap between rich and poor is growing worldwide, contributing to political instability.
5. Standing up for human rights by setting international standards for the rights of children, women and minorities, monitoring abuses and letting governments know that 'the whole world is watching'.
6. Improving health and education by helping poorer countries to provide more and better services, and working to prevent the spread of global diseases like AIDS.
7. Building democracy by helping countries conduct free and fair elections. UN observers have monitored elections in Haiti, South Africa, Nicaragua, East Timor and other countries.
